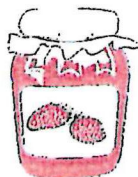


Bottle bank

- One way bottles (e.g. juice, wine bottles)
- Glass jars (e.g. for edible oil, vinegar, bath salts)
- All types of screw top jars (baby food, gherkin, jam, mustard jars)
- Drinking glasses



Do not belong in bottle bank:

- Ceramics
- China
- Mirrors
- Plate glass
- Screw tops/bottle caps



Return deposit one and multi way bottles to the shop

Can Container

All kind of cans could be also given into the yellow sack



- Pet food cans (NB: Small portions are in aluminium cans and belong in the yellow sack)
- Tins cans (e.g. from vegetables, fruit, soups etc.)

Return deposit cans to the shop

Hazardous Waste

- Paint remover
- Brake fluid
- Disinfectants
- Paints (liquid)
- fire extinguishers
- Photo chemicals
- Wood preservatives
- Putty filler, wax
- Glues
- Condensers
- Laboratory chemicals
- Solvents
- Furniture polishes
- Oily rags
- Herbicides
- Acids, alkaloids
- Pesticides
- Edible and deep fry oil
- Spray cans (with harmful contents)
- Thermometers
- Benzine

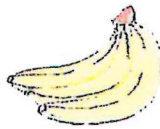
The way to

General waste - grey bin

- Ashes (cold)
- Photos
- Rubber
- Hygiene articles (e.g. cotton buds, condoms)
- Cat litter, pet litter
- Paper, dirty
- Other material, badly dirtied
- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Street sweepings
- Scrap wall paper
- Animal litter
- Nappies
- Cigarette filters and ash

Bio waste - green bin

- Left over bread
- Egg shells
- Coffee filters
- Fish bones
- Left over meat (usual household quantities)
- Vegetable waste (e.g. onion skins, potato peelings, lettuce leaves)
- Coffee grounds
- Bones (small quantities)
- Milk and flour products
- Nutshells, fruit peelings (e.g. oranges, bananas)
- Tissues
- Left over food (usual household quantities)
- Tea leaves and teabags
- Pruned branches (up to 15cm circumference)
- Flowers
- Garden waste
- Leaves
- Cut grass and plants
- Weeds



Do not belong in green bin:

- Ashes
- Plastic bags (bio degradable)
- Animal litter
- Left overs from restaurant kitchens



Paper - blue bin

- Envelopes (also with windows)
- Books
- Egg cartons
- Magazines
- Calendars
- Cardboard boxes (tear up)
- Catalogues
- Brown paper
- Cardboard
- Brochures
- Exercise books
- Writing paper
- Telephone directories
- Paper packaging clean (e.g. soap, toothpaste)
- Newspapers



Yellow sack

- all kind of cans
- Aluminium (e.g. trays, foil, lids)
- Foamed plastic (e.g. trays for meat, vegetables, fruit)
- Plastic tubs (e.g. from margarine, yoghurt, buttermilk, milk products)
- Plastic bottles (e.g. dish washing liquid, liquid detergents, hygiene products)
- Plastic foils (e.g. plastic bags, freezer bags, clear film, cling film,
- Emptied spray cans, which contained no harmful contents (e.g. from whipped cream, spray plaster, body spray)
- Laminated packaging (e.g. drink cartons for milk and juices, vacuum packages, sweet packages, deep freeze packages)



- Bicycles
- Garden equipment
- Furniture (e.g. tables, chairs, cupboards, mattresses, shelves etc.)
- Stoves and radiators that were not built in (without oil)
- Lawn mowers (with empty tank)
- Sport and games equipment
- Carpeting



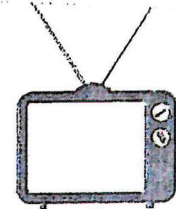
Do not belong to oversize waste:

- Motor vehicles

- Kitchen ovens
- HiFi equipment
- Coffee makers
- Refrigerators and freezers
- Monitors
- Night storage heaters
- Electric shavers
- Toasters
- Washing machines and dishwashers
- Tumble dryers
